Board Meeting Minutes

Location: Sherri Basehoar's in Inola
Time: 2:00 p.m.
Present: Sherri Basehoar, Billy Walker, Walter Walker, Angie Evans, Ric Banks, Wendy Banks, Carol Johnson, Cathey Hazelwood

This meeting was called to discuss plans for the Sooner ApHC Spring Appaloosa/Open Horse Show scheduled for March 1, 2003 at the Tulsa Exposition Center (Fairgrounds).

The meeting was called to order at 2:15 p.m.

Show Status

- * Carol reported that we have booked Barn "C" at the Tulsa Fairgrounds on March 1st for our Spring horse show. We will have the North Arena for the June 7th show. Carol has paid the required \$160 deposit to the Fairgrounds, which is for both shows. The arena rental rate is \$400 for each show. Carol estimates the approximate cost to put on this show at \$2000.
- * The stall fee being charged by the Fairgrounds is \$14. We will charge \$20 to exhibitors. We can have access to the arena and stalls beginning at noon on February 28th. We will need to find out if the Fairgrounds charges extra for exhibitors wishing to arrive on Friday afternoon or evening. If so, we will need to adjust the stall rental price accordingly. Shavings will be available at the Fairgrounds for purchase, approximately \$5 per bag. It is believed that one supplier at the Fairgrounds handles the shavings and we would not be able to supply our own as a fundraiser to the club. Question was asked if we can bring our own shavings for our individual use.
- * Carol noted that NEOSHA will also be hosting a show on March 1st at the Fairgrounds. We hope to pick up some exhibitors from their show as well as some other events. Discussion took place about marking off the area around our arena so it does not get jammed up with vehicles and horse trailers attending the other events.

January 5, 2003

- * Merchandise booths can be displayed for a \$30 charge per booth. The Fairgrounds has chairs and tables available for rental. There is a \$100 arena preparation charge for the tractor. The Fairgrounds will prepare the grounds 1 time and any after that will charge \$30, unless we supply our own tractor operator to drag the arena. Food and beverages to be available by Fine Host. Discussion took place about having a hospitality booth offering coffee and donuts in the morning.
- * The judges hired are Billy Gene Baber and Keith Longacre. Keith Longacre charges overtime. Jerry Donaghue and Lee Troup Johnson are the judges booked for the June show. Discussion took place about feeding them lunch and whether or not to do that onsite at the grounds or take them out for lunch. We also need to supply them with water/drinks.
- * We will have one judge for the Open classes and two judges for the ApHC classes. Classes can be combined depending on the number of entrants. Discussion took place about having a minimum of 3 to make a class.
- * Ric Banks agreed to be the stall coordinator. Carol will obtain a copy of the stall Platte for him.
- * We need to check the status of our ribbon supply and place an order if needed.
- * Discussion took place about getting showbills out to other ApHC clubs in nearby states. The Oklahoma ApHC club will be posting our showbill in their newsletter and we will do the same for them. They have also agreed to give their member list so we can mail showbills to them.
- * Wendy will forward information on photographer, Lisa Renfrow, to Carol.
