Introducing Dedra Tiger, New Member & Web Master

As one of the newest members of SApHC, I believe that members of an organization should be as active as possible. Therefore, I offered to take over the task of webmaster for our club web site. My son-in-law, Brian (another new, yet shy member), and I own MTH Hosting & Design, a web hosting and design company in Bixby, OK, and offered the redesign, maintenance, hosting and domain name fee with this belief in mind. (Insider info: the MTH in our company name stands for "Mane, Tail, Hooves"! We used MTH, so as not to seem biased toward horses, making it seem that we catered to the creation of horse web site, exclusively.)

As a teenager and a relative, by marriage, I worked on Allen Ranch and fell in love with horses. In the beginning, the ranch paid for itself by selling well broke horses for children and novice riders. Ted Allen would go to the Bristow sale and bring back a semi load of horses - 30 to 50 head at a time. Since there were so many of us, 9 in all, he would divide up each load between all the kids. The faster we turned our horses into ridable stock, the more dividends we could expect from the ranch. (I got my first horse and all my tack that way.) One of the biggest dividends was the horse knowledge I gained from day-to-day work on the ranch.

After marriage, I was away from horses for years until my twins, Nadia and Sophia, became involved with a paint horse breeding farm in our area. Horses vicariously re-entered my life! Several years later, Nadia and Brian purchased Dunitforthelasttime (Scooby) from Easter Creek Farms, in LA. They boarded Scooby and Nadia's Thoroughbred, Soda, at the race horse farm where Nadia was employed. At this farm, the owner also bred Appaloosas and had some of the finest Appy stock I had ever seen, to that point. His mare, Minus A Freckle, shot down my old belief about "crazy Appys". Freckles, a big liver spotted Leopard, was one of the best working

ranch horses I had ever ridden! \

After finding the farm in Bixby and moving the horses on the place, I came to live with Nadia and Brian, helping them wherever I could. I loved to work with the horses on the ground, cleaning stalls, feeding - any task that needed doing! Annie, a Thoroughbred mare, was a lease horse that joined the troupe, mid-year. Late in 2002, Nadia found Confirmed Approval (Mack), bred by Rubys Ranch, in MO. Somehow, Nadia came up with the money to buy him and Mack became a part of the evergrowing family. (We kid Nadia that she, like Will Rogers, "Never met a horse she didn't like!")

Nadia was in need of a web site to display her horses, so a farm name was needed. Since half of the herd were "rescue" horses, the "Freedom Farms" name seemed a natural. Brian purchased the domain name as a Christmas present and I went to work on the site. Working with the horses was a part of our daily routine and continues to be a part of it today.

In April, 2003, I purchased Annie (TB) from her owner, whose husband was being transferred. But the "grandhorses", Mack and Scooby, are special. When I am stuck for an idea or frustrated with HTML coding, I go to the barn for a break. Being out there with our "herd" is relaxing and often humorous! Currently, I am working with Scooby, under saddle, in an effort to discover this colt's area of interest. For the most part, Nadia works with Mack, in hand. It is very satisfying to see these guys' progress and our efforts be rewarded with each task mastered

So, here we sit, with a pasture of Appaloosas and Thoroughbreds, surrounded by AQHA neighbors. If it wasn't bad enough having "crazy" Appys, we also have those "crazy" Thoroughbreds and ride English, to boot. But we're winning them over, one person at a time!
