Beware of Fraudulent Offers!

Excerpts from the ApHC Newsletter:

Equine.com has informed the Appaloosa Horse Club of fraudulent purchases being perpetrated on horse owners, and several Appaloosa owners have reported being contacted with offers to purchase their horses by a "person" in Nigeria. The ApHC and Equine.com caution you to take extra care when selling horses overseas.

Aaron T. Bromagem, president of Equine.com, writes: "People selling horses are receiving buyer inquiries from a third party regarding the purchase of a horse from a potential buyer in Nigeria or Africa. This inquiry commonly attempts to arrange a purchase with a cashier's check covering the price of the horse and shipping. After the horse has been shipped, they commonly ask you to refund the shipping charges as part of a finder's-fee arrangement.

Unfortunately, the cashier's check is counterfeit. This fact is not uncovered until the horse and the finder's fee have been forwarded to the scam artists.

To protect yourselves and others against this type of activity, it's important to obtain as much information about the buyer as possible. If you suspect the buyer may be involved in this or similar scams, please forward any information you can obtain to the following organizations:

The ApHC article lists scam indicators to be aware of. The final thought of the article was the old saying, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is."

Tiny's Shinin Star



Financial Report

Cathey Hazelwood presented the Financial Reports for the months of December 2002 and January 2003. Copies of the reports were distributed during the meeting. Regarding shavings for the show, a person can bring their own from home or purchase them from Pete's at the Tulsa Expo. We cannot bring our own shavings to sell for profit.
