March 14th Clinic Fun, Informative

It rained the day before and the day after, but the March 14th was bright and clear. We met at the Windsong Arena in Adair on a brisk, clear Sunday afternoon.

Jim Chronister went over the basics of showmanship with the clinic attendees. Jim emphasized that both training and grooming in preparation for a showmanship class *must* happen well in advance of the class. He demonstrated the correct stance for the horse and the exhibitor and discussed how to present the horse. Did you know the horse is quartered in showmanship? Sounds scary, but it refers to where the exhibitor needs to be in relationship to the judge and the horse. Jim also demonstrated how to safely hold the horse's lead.

Donna Chronister discussed grooming essentials, recommending quiet clippers and don't forget the basics like brushes and scissors. She also emphasized that the exhibitor needs to be well-groomed and neat as well. The clinic attendees really paid attention to both Jim and Donna.

Carol discussed how to present your horse safely, emphasizing the importance of keeping space between your horse and the other horses in the class. She also pointed out the importance of presenting your pride in your horse in a showmanship class—a significant part of the score is based on the exhibitor.

Once having gone through the basics, Jim

set up a showmanship course, and the exhibitors got to practice what they've learned. Oops, it's harder than it sounds. The horses didn't go straight; some didn't trot, some didn't set up. Kaitlynn was reminded why you need to be careful with spacing your horse during the final lineup.

After completing the showmanship practice class, Charles Bottger shared his show experiences. "Show your horse the entire time you're in the arena," Charley advised. Jim reminded everyone that it's hard to be sure if you're being observed when there are two-four judges in the arena. An important point to remember!

Next came the mounted session. Jim went through what was expected in a rail class. Once again, Jim emphasized preparation of horse and rider *before* the show. Carol emphasized safety once again, discussing safe ways to pass another horse (never go between a horse and the fence), and again emphasized safe spacing of the horses. And finally, they got to ride! The riders got to practice spacing their horses, circling their horse to get more space, and safely passing another horse. Also, they got to practice doing all of this while listening for the instructions for gait and direction.

Everyone had a good time and learned something. Many thanks to Jim, Donna, Carol, Charley, and others who shared their knowledge at this event.

May 16th Trail Ride—Walnut Creek State Park

Join us May 16th at 3:00 p.m. at Walnut Creek State Park for our Spring trail ride. There are tables and facilities at the park, so join us even if you don't plan to ride. Bring something to share—we'll eat after the ride.

From the Cimarron Turnpike (HW412), take the 209th Street exit. Travel north on this road for 13 miles. Turn left at the Walnut Creek State Park sign. Continue on the park road to the Hitching Post campground. Turn left into the campground and turn left on to the campground road. There are sites and parking for trailers. Each site has a table and fire pit.

Thank you for your prayers and thoughts.

For those who don't know, Frankie stuck his foot through the fence 2 and a half weeks ago and opened up the coffin joint. We worked closely with Pryor Veterinary Clinic and Chell Prop on his care. Frankie required constant care, and was making progress. The joint started to close up, but the stress from the injury and the medications to treat the infection took their toll. A week ago, Frankie colicked and started with diarrhea Tuesday. We thought we were really close to getting it under control when he just went down hill on Saturday from being weak.

Our thanks to Chell and Pryor Vet. They did a fantastic job. I am forever grateful for their help. We got to bring him home and treat him here because he was more at peace and comfortable than he was at the vet's.

Before the meeting began, Carol Johnson spoke about the possibility of placing horse sale barn contact information and web site urls, if any, on the Sooner site Links page. The information could be readily accessed in the case of another horse theft. Members expressed relief over the recovery of Polkadot by SHI.

Minutes of February 22, 2004 Meeting

Minutes from the February 22, 2004, meeting were reviewed. There was a motion from Nadia Loden to accept the minutes, as read, and seconded by Leslie Chapman.

Financial Report

Members were given a copy of the Financial Report of January 25 to April 15, 2004. Dedra Tiger gave Carol Johnson, in lieu of Angie McGee, a personal check for \$150.00 for the PayPal SSA purchase of American Revolution. Dedra noted that the breakdown was \$125.00 for the Futurity and \$25.00 for the office fee to be deposited in the general fund.

April 18th Grooming Clinic

Sunday, April 18th, was *windy* in the extreme. Although there was no rain, we were really glad to have an indoor facility for this clinic!

Several members, including Angie McGee and Sophia Sokolowski, had to work. Others were at the OAHC show. With the wind factor, our attendance was light. Those who were able to make the clinic found it interesting and informative. We also welcomed visitors Betty Gordineer, Linda Graves, and Marsha Webber.

Mattie Webber, Rogers County 4H member and successful exhibitor in 4H, Paint and Pinto shows, presented grooming and braiding tips to us. One of the "biggies" was to start preparatory grooming for a show well in advance of the show. It's important for both you and your horse to be comfortable with the grooming processes and techniques well before the final show grooming begins. Mattie emphasized the importance of getting your horse used to the clippers and trimming before trying to trim for a show. She also suggested trimming a week ahead of time to allow any mistakes time to grow out a little, then doing your final "fine" trimming before the show. Nadia asked about trimming around the leg and hoof area. Mattie showed several techniques. Nadia mentioned not trimming white socks too closely, mentioning her first experience when she did this. Mattie discussed vari-

ous ways to highlight the white socks, but Nadia reminded everyone that we are not to use color enhancers in Appaloosa shows—she learned this the hard way last year.

Other points Mattie made were to be sure your clipper blades are sharp, and don't have any nicks. Your horse won't appreciate having hair pulled, especially in the ears. Carol mentioned her experience with Babe, and having to retrain on clipping ears after making this mistake. Our guests, Linda and Betty, asked about getting a foal used to clippers. Mattie and Carol showed them the small Wahl clippers that fit in the palm of your hand. From experience, these work well on "baby fuzz".

Next, Mattie demonstrated brushing, clipping, and braiding on our equine model, HazaChance. Chance was not thrilled as we entered the barn, because of the wind noises. As he was brushed, clipped, and combed, Chance really got into being a model. He relaxed and soaked up the attention and the compliments. He even let Ashlie Dziewa put a feather in one of his braids.

Each of us who attended the clinic learned something informative or was reminded of things we knew, but had started to ignore. Our thanks to Mattie for a thoughtful, informative clinic.
