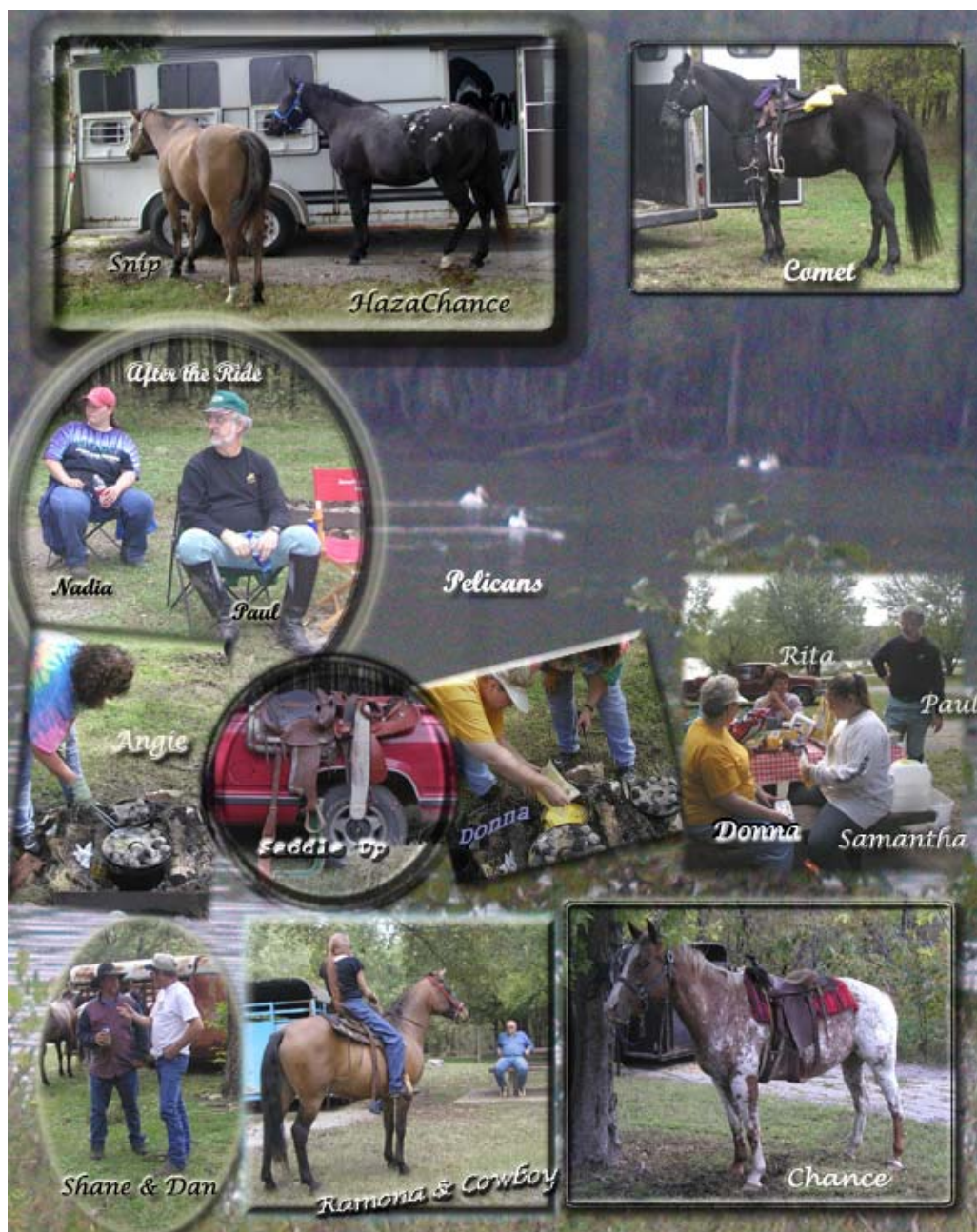

General Meeting Minutes September 21, 2003

Barn A available June 5th & 6th. They have nothing available in October, 2004. We have a tentative hold with them for those dates. We need to let them know something within 7 days. The cost is \$450 per day, stalls \$16 each and \$1 per horse fee.

Claremore Expo is available the 3rd weekend in June (June 18-19-20). Claremore is \$800 a day for the indoor arena. The outdoor arena is available for \$350 per day. They do not have any available dates in October.

The meeting was called to order at 4:25 p.m.

Minutes of August 24, 2003 Meeting

Minutes from the August 24th meeting were reviewed.

Upon motion made by Jim Chronister and seconded by Angelia McGee, minutes of the August 24, 2003 were approved as presented.

Financial Report

A financial report representing income/expenses for the period August 24 - September 21, 2003 was distributed and reviewed. As of the date of this meeting, the Club has a current checkbook balance of \$1,170.67. Total deposits for the period was \$72.00 and no expenses for the month.

2004 Club Events/ Shows

Carol and Nadia recently visited several barns to get an idea of what's available to us for 2004 shows. The Tulsa Fairgrounds has Barn C available on May 15th and

The Payne County arena in Stillwater is available the 3rd weekend in June (June 19-20) and the 2nd weekend in October, 2004 (October 9-10). The cost is \$800 for a 2-day show and \$600 for a 1-day show. This comes with 60 stalls. They have a shower area, heated washrack and \$10 per day trailer electrical hook-up. Access to it is good. The exercise arena is not covered and it is away from the barn. The concession would also be open during our shows. They have a meeting room that could be utilized for \$100 which includes a kitchen and they have a very nice show office. The Stillwater Chamber is very willing to help us in getting good rates on lodging accommodations.

Overall, Nadia and Carol liked the Stillwater facilities best. We need to decide whether or not to have a 1-day or 2-day show. Discussion took place about talking with the Kansas Appaloosa Club about co-pointing a 2-day show with us.

Jim Chronister has graciously agreed to be our announcer for both shows again in 2004.

The Annual Meeting will be held on November 16th at 4:00 p.m. Location to be determined.

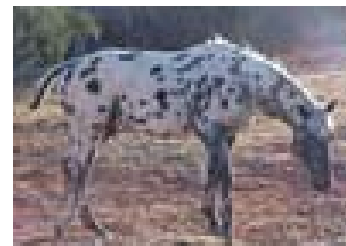
