# Winter and Your Horse

With winter fast approaching, here are some tips to keep your horse happy, healthy, and safe during the winter months.

- Make sure fresh, unfrozen water is always available. One of the leading causes of colic in the winter months is insufficient water consumption. Heaters in water buckets and tanks are an easy way to keep your horses' water source from freezing up and encouraging them to drink more.
- Feed extra hay, not grain, to help warm your horse. Hay is a much more effective heating fuel and does not carry the same risks for colic or laminitis that excess grain can bring.
- > Check your horses feet regularly. Trush, abscesses, white line disease, and sole bruises all occur more often in the winter months.
- Worm your horse against bots following the first frost.
- ➤ Have your horses' teeth checked by your vet or equine dentist to make sure your horses are able to utilize their feed properlyl.
- Most horses do not require blankets if they have adequate shelter, even in show or rain. The exception of course is clipped horses, horses maintaining a show coat, or others that don't grow a natural coat.
- > Consult with your veterinarian for advice on helping elderly or compromised horses with special needs.
